Son of Tom & Lydia Barlow; husband of Beryl Lilian Barlow of Castle Acre, Norfolk.   |

| Arthur J Calvert | WW2 | Arthur James Calvert Flying Officer 45897 218 Squadron, Air Gunner Short Stirling.<br>Died 23 <sup>rd</sup> Sept 1942 age 26. Runnymede Memorial<br>Son of George & Frances, husband of Margaret Aitken Calvert of Pittenweem, Fife   |
| Donald Canham    | WW2 | Donald Arthur Canham 3 <sup>rd</sup> Radio Officer, SS Wayfarer (Liverpool)<br>Died 19 <sup>th</sup> Aug 1944, age 22. Tower Hill Memorial  |
| Walter Cattle    | WW1 | Malton War Memorial WW1   |
| Alec Dale        | WW2 | Alick Thomas Dale, Gunner 1118102 RHA. 287 (The Northumberland Hussars) anti-tank battery 107 (South Notts Hussars) Regt.<br>Died 6 <sup>th</sup> June 1942 aged 29, Alamein Memorial. Husband of A A Dale of Full Sutton. Killed during the Battle of Knightsbridge, the battery (25 pdrs) was ordered to stand firm and was wiped out by relentless panzer attacks over three days. Subject of a famous painting. |
| Marion Edwards   | WW2 | Senior Mistress, left the school in 1917 due to ill health. Killed in a London air raid in July 1941 whilst serving refreshments to firemen.  |

| William Goodwill | WW2 | William Goodwill Sgt 620440 44 Squadron<br>Died 11 <sup>th</sup> Sept 1940 age 22. Becklingen War Cemetery<br>Son of Mary Agnes Goodwill of Hovingham.  |
| Louis Glynn      | WW2 | Louis Charles Glynn Chief Officer SS Saugor (London)<br>Died 27 <sup>th</sup> Aug 1941 age 33. Tower Hill Memorial.<br>Son of James Henry & Lily Gertrude of Swinton Grange.  |
| John Holliday    | WW2 | John Newlove Holliday Private 4390309 5 <sup>th</sup> Bn Green Howards<br>Died 11 <sup>th</sup> April 1945 age 25. Berlin 1939-1945 War Cemetery.<br>Son of John & Emily of Coneysthorpe  |
| John Hollington  | WW2 | John Raymond Hollington Flying Officer 37881 224 Squadron<br>Died 30 <sup>th</sup> Sept 1939 age 21. Kiel War Cemetery.<br>Son of Joseph James Lockett & Marie Stuart of Westbury-on-Trym, Bristol  |
| Edgar Hopperton  | WW2 | Edgar Hopperton Sgt 625352 217 Squadron<br>Died 11 <sup>th</sup> Aug 1940 age 20. Runnymede Memorial.<br>Son of Christiana Sarah Jane of Flaxton  |
| Billy Hudson     | WW2 | C F Hudson & J B E Hudson on Malton Memorial WW2  |

| John Lupton<br><i>Brother of Mark</i> | WW2 | John Lupton Flight Sgt 1381331 RAFVR (no squadron recorded)<br>Died 29 Dec 1943 aged 29, Sheffield Crematorium.<br>Son of Mark & Sarah Ann Lupton, husband of Betty Lupton, Stillington.  |
| Mark Lupton                           | WW2 | Mark Lupton Sgt 1456999 RAFVR 410 (RCAF) Squadron<br>Died 23 Jan 1943 aged 34. Runnymede Memorial.<br>Son of Mark & Sarah Lupton, husband of Laura Mary Lupton, Skellow, Yorks.<br>410 was a night-fighter squadron formed at Ayr on 30 June 1941. Between Oct 1942 and Feb 1943 the squadron was at Acklington in Northumberland converting from Beaufighters to Mosquitoes.   |
| Godfrey Mennell                       | WW2 | T G L Mennell on Malton War Memorial WW2, Leading Seaman RN   |
| Pat Mitchell                          | WW2 | Sgt John Patrick D'Arley 550746 10 Squadron, WOP/Air Gunner died 8 Aug 1940. Born 1920 in Brighton moved to Rillington area when young. Son of Capt George William & Marie Louisa Mitchell of West Heslerton. Attended Rillington school, before Malton, joined RAF age 15. Contracted a serious illness around the end of June 1940 and died at Ilkley 8 Aug 1940, buried Thorpe Bassett churchyard with CWGC headstone. |
| G Wallace Piercy                      | WW1 | Malton War Memorial WW1   |
| Wilfred Sowersby                      | WW1 | There are two W Sowersbys on the CWGC website; one serving in the Tank Corps, killed 27 Sept 1918 and the other in the Loyal North Lancashire Regt. killed 20 Aug 1918.   |
| Edmund Taylor                         | WW1 | There are six Edmund Taylors on the CWGC the most likely one serving in the 18 <sup>th</sup> Bn Durham Light Infantry killed 19 July 1918.  |

Sent on a photo mission to Brunsbittel/Wilhelmshaven and failed to return. The Hudson was claimed as shot down by Lt Heinz Demes of 4/JG77 flying an Me109 at Brunsbittel. F/O Hollington was recovered from the sea on the 27th November west of Tammwarft, Pellworm, was initially buried at Husum but now rests in Kiel War Cemetery. Sgt Pitts was washed ashore on the 17th November and rests in Klitmoller Churchyard, Denmark, while AC1 Rout and AC1 Bathgate are commemorated on the Runnymede Memorial.
