## Recognising Achievement at Malton School

### House Points and Congratulatory Referrals

These are awarded for good work throughout the year.

### Commendations

On three occasions during the school year teachers are asked to nominate one student in each of their teaching groups who has performed well in respect of the level of attainment they reach, the effort they apply, or the improvement they have made. A commendation letter signed by the Head and Deputy is then presented personally to each student.

### House Ties

Students are invited to apply for house ties. Awards are made on the quality of their application. Attendance, effort, house points (at least 500), commendations, service to school, responsibility, and participation in school life are all taken into consideration.

### Examinations Success

Grades in all subjects taken are aggregated and students are ranked in order of their performance. The top ten students in each year group receive a letter of congratulations.

### Half-termly reward assemblies

Students are recognised for attendance, house points, good records and good performance in a special assembly, where prizes are awarded.

### Annual Awards

To qualify for an award, students either gained three or more commendations, or they finished in the top ten in their year group. A special limited edition of enamel badges is commissioned for the awards, based on the school shield. Even more limited are badges for students who have received awards in three years, five years and seven years. These students also receive a book prize.

An annual rewards trip is organised to a local theme park. All students who have achieved fifty house points, but no significant negatives, isolations or detentions, are invited to go on the trip.

## Review of 2010-11

### September 2010

- We welcome five new members to the teaching staff: Mrs Bloxwich and Miss England to the English Department, Miss Cooper and Mr Rumney to Science and Mr Bruce to Mathematics. Mrs Robson joins the Science Department, Ms Gillick joins the Learning Manager Team and Mrs Ward & Mrs Brownless to the Midday Supervisory Team. The school has a population of 734, including 201 students in the sixth form.
- The fourth annual rewards trip takes place at Flamingo Land to reward those students who worked well during the year. The weather is fine and sunny all day. Meanwhile, Year 7 spend the day taking part in various activities at Carlton Lodge Outdoor Activity Centre near Thirsk.
- Talk on gardens in school hall raises £480 for Save the Children.
- Tony Curtis, American film actor famous for his roles in *Some Like it Hot* and *Spartacus*, dies at the age of 84.

### October

- Year 13 A Level Government & Politics students visit New York for a week-long trip taking in visits to schools, meetings with politicians at all levels of US Government and a visit to Washington DC.
- On Special Day, Year 7 enjoy a trip to York Minister, Year 8 travel to Sheffield to the Magna Science Museum and Year 9 enjoy a backstage tour of the Theatre Royal in York. NYBEP come into school to engage the Year 10 students in business enterprise workshops. 89 Year 5 primary students from feeder schools come to us and 'buddy up' with our Year 11 students.
- Year 12 and 13 Geography students undertake a study tour of Switzerland, visiting the Altesch glacier, Bex salt mines, Saas Fee, Leukerband and the Mattmark Dam.
- English Department hold a poetry competition and quiz in response to National Poetry Day. Niamh Williams takes the lower school award, Teerakan Muankeauw the upper school award and Mr Steel in the staff category.
- Sports Hall - progress continues well. The all-weather football pitches are now installed, with five-a-side nets as well as a full size pitch surrounded by floodlights.

- Year 7 students organise a bring and buy sale and raise the magnificent sum of £172 to go to Romanian charities.

### **November**

- The 12th Annual Celebration Evening takes place. The hall is packed to the limits, as parents and students, governors and special guests gather to review the previous year in the life of the school, reviewing one of the most successful years the school has had.
- The school is very well represented by students, staff and governors at the Remembrance Day service at the War Memorial on Yorkersgate. Students from the school are participating in the ranks of the cadets, the scouts and the guides.
- Malton music students play host to counterparts from Nordhemskolan in Sweden, a music-based exchange programme.
- Simon James, a well-known children's author and illustrator, is welcomed into school to speak to students of all year groups.
- Anne McIntosh MP visits school to meet Year 12 Government & Politics students to discuss local and national issues.
- The whole school takes part in a sponsored walk raising over £5000 for sports equipment. Even the Swedish visitors enjoy a brisk walk in the chilly autumn sun!
- Progress on the sports hall continues well and we are very close to completion. Former England international Mike Catt visits the centre organised by rugby development officer Dan Coates and supported by Yorkshire Bank.
- Snovember—early widespread winter snowfall takes most of country by surprise.

### **December**

- A level Business Studies and Economics students depart on a three day trip to the capital, visiting the Houses of Parliament, the Trade Union Congress, the Bank of England, The Old bailey and Canary Wharf.
- Mr Jay Rowley is appointed Community Sports Manager of Malton Community Sports Centre.
- Like much of the country, we suffer from exceptionally heavy early snow and bitterly cold temperatures. We manage to stay open all but one day. Once again, snow clearance is hampered as grit supplies run low.

- In Citizenship, Year 8 students have been learning about law and order, with visits to school by York Magistrates who conduct mock trials with groups. Students also visit Malton Police Station, where students watch CCTV cameras whilst one of the students takes part in a 'mock arrest' in a local shop.
- Malton school manage to stage the traditional Christmas celebrations and events, despite the bad weather at the end of term. The annual Christmas Concert takes place with a varied programme of music, song, dance and comedy. The Sixth Form pantomime this year is Alice in Wonderland.
- The annual invitation to celebrate Christmas went out to senior members of the local community. Guests are treated to food and drink and entertainment from students, as well as receiving gifts from Santa and his helpers. Thankfully the weather holds out (just!) to allow guests to get here and back home safely.
- We see the return of a former tradition at school, when Year 7 and Year 8 students visit St Michael's Church for a carol service conducted by Reverend Bowes.
- Air House wins the house trophy for 2010.
- A cold, arctic airstream brings further snow and ice causing chaos and severe disruption to the road and rail network with several airports being closed. Temperature records are broken including a new record low for Northern Ireland of -18.7 °C recorded on 23 December 2010.
- Matt Cardle wins the X-Factor.
- Pete Postlethwaite OBE, British actor best known for his role in Brassed Off, dies.
- Russia and Qatar are selected as the locations for the 2018 and 2022 FIFA World Cups respectively.

### **January 2011**

- Big freeze - further problems when extreme sub-zero temperatures burst pipes and flood much of West Wing over the holiday. We open for Years 11, 12 and 13 on the first day of term, and manage full opening on the second, with some areas out of bounds until repairs can be carried out.
- Year 12 students, as part of their Government & Politics studies, visit the Houses of Parliament and also take in a tour of the Palace of Westminster and see a debate in the House of Commons.

- Parents of students in Years 7, 8 and 9 attend our annual Review Days to review progress. Demonstrations take place on the new 'parent portal', where parents can view key information about their children on-line.
- High attendances at both Sixth Form Open Evening and Year 9 Options Fair.
- A 'Pig Racing Night' raised £1570 to go towards the Gibraltar sports trip fund for equipment.

## February

- We welcome Mr Andrew Massey, Mr Matty Hood, Miss Alex Scruton and Mrs Alison Hyde to the Malton Community Sports Centre staff.
- Malton Community Sports Centre (MCSC) is officially opened by the Archbishop of York, Dr Jon Sentamu - the whole school is present, along with guests. Facilities in the £2.5 million project include basketball, badminton, football, hockey, cricket and climbing, with eight 15m floodlights on the multi-use games area alongside the building.
- Both Key Stage 3 Boys and Key Stage 4 Girls badminton teams secure convincing victories in the Partnership Badminton tournaments.
- Both Houses of Parliament remain deadlocked over controversial legislation to hold a referendum on changing the voting system for general elections
- Hollywood pin-up of 40s and 50s, Jane Russell, dies.

## March

- Eleanor Green, Lucy Mitchell and Daniel Ingham take part in the regional finals of the 'Youth Speaks Competition'.
- Staff and students raise over £1000 for Comic Relief. The main event of the day is the 'Cha Cha Slide' led by Mr Bruce from the Maths department.
- More than 250,000 people have attended a march and rally in central London against public spending cuts.
- A 6.2 magnitude earthquake and tsunami strikes the nuclear power station at Fukushima, Japan. A building housing a reactor was destroyed, but authorities say the reactor itself was intact. The government play down fears of a meltdown at the Fukushima 1 plant.

- Elizabeth Taylor, British actor, dies. She is best known for her roles in National Velvet, The Giant and Cleopatra, and for being married eight times to seven husbands (twice to the late Richard Burton).
- A New Dawn? Western Sahara and the Arab Spring - a revolutionary wave of demonstrations and protests occurring in the Arab world, amongst others, Tunisia, Egypt, Bahrain, Syria and Yemen and a civil war in Libya. Many demonstrations have met with violent responses from authorities.

## April

- Year 7 students hold an Easter Egg Draw and raise a further £129 towards Romanian charities.
- The annual Easter shows this year invites people to a Disney Night. Over 100 performers take part on the last two nights of term, all of their performances being inspired by music from Disney productions. Music teachers Jessica Kettlewell and Anita Langdale rehearse all the musical groups - including two choirs, orchestra, soloists and two drama groups.
- Over Easter, the PE department take 48 students to Gibraltar on their first ever international sports tour. Students compete in Hockey, Netball and Rugby.
- Mr Williams turns tour guide as 40 Year 10 students plus other staff visit the battlefields of Belgium. The highlight of the trip for many was participating in the nightly Last Post ceremony in Ypres, which commemorates all the soldiers of the British Empire who died during the Battle of Ypres.
- Well done to Mrs Wise who competes and completes her first London Marathon raising over £1300 for Macmillan Nurses.
- Heatwave sees warmest UK April for more than 100 years. The dry April followed a dry March which saw less than half of the normal rainfall falling across the UK.
- Tickets go on sale for London 2012.
- Billabriggs, ridden by Jason Maguire, wins the Grand National.
- Osama Bin Laden killed in US military assault.
- Sir Henry Cooper, British and Commonwealth and European Champion boxer, dies.
- The Royal Wedding of Prince William and Kate Middleton takes place in Westminster Abbey.
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## May

- Auction of Promises in aid of the Sports Ambassadors trip to Romania raises over £1500.
- Year 13 A Level students finish normal timetable classes on Friday 27 May. They have lessons up to breaktime, followed by a special assembly. The school puts on a buffet lunch before they depart to make the necessary preparations for their leavers' ball in the evening.
- Over 80 students plus staff guests attend the ball at The Royal York Hotel in York. The weather is fine and the beautiful surroundings are used to take photographs.
- Over 100 students take part in the initial stages of Malton Food Festival Competition. Five prize winners are Annie Farrow, Emily Metcalfe, Rosie Roberts, Naomi Richardson and Philippa Norman. The overall winner, Annie Farrow, is invited to recreate her winning menu at the Malton Food Lovers Festival.
- Head Boy and Girl elections are held in which Year 10 students and staff vote, using a transferable vote system.

- The final day in school for year 11 starts with a special assembly, a reception at breaktime and group photos, more photos at lunchtime, and a final school lunch provided by the school. The afternoon is filled with entertainment from the students themselves, video clips of students dancing, a video of then and now – Year 7 to 11 school photos – special awards, and much more. There are tears at the end of the day as emotions get the better of some students.
- Liberal Democrats suffer in local elections, being 'blamed' for coalition spending cuts.
- Spanish golfer, Seve Ballesteros dies.
- Queen Elizabeth II makes first State Visit to the Republic of Ireland.

## June

- Class of 2006-11 gather in their finest suits and dresses for their Prom held in the school hall, arriving in an array of transport from limousine, horse and carriage, tractors, vintage cars and sports cars.
- On 23 June we hold our biggest ever Annual Art Exhibition which is extremely well attended by a most enthusiastic and appreciative audience. **Paige Platt and Louis Newman** are the joint winners of the Emma Howard Memorial Trophy.
- Rory McIlroy wins his first major - the US Open.
- Greek crisis - public react with strikes and violent protests on the streets of Athens after Greece's parliament holds a vote on its austerity programme.
- Sebastian Coe unveils the torch for the 2012 London Olympics at St Pancras Station. The golden aluminium tube features a lace-like mesh with 8,000 holes that represent the number of bearers and how many miles it will travel in the 70-day relay across the UK.
- Queen Elizabeth II and the Duke of Edinburgh celebrate their 85th and 90th birthdays respectively!

## July

- Students take part in our annual school production of Alan Ayckbourn's *Ernie's Incredible Illucinations*.
- Sixth form students visit Yorkshire Art Sculpture Park as part of their Art A level course.
- All year groups participate in the Enterprise Challenge Competition, beating last year's target and raising in excess of £1700 through a range of initiatives. Congratulations to Peggy Ullyott who raised over £500 towards this challenge!
- Apprentice-style presentations take place where teams of Year 12 Business Studies students pitch their proposals on 'how to improve the school dining experience' to Mr Williams and representatives of McCain and the business world .
- 50 Year 7 pupils take part in the Green Energy Challenge, an inter-school competition coordinated by Nybep. Pupils are asked to invent a product to promote an eco-friendly lifestyle. The winning team of Katie Thompson, Emmy Weatherill, Kerry Scott, Georgia Tiffany, Olive Ferguson and Eleanor Anson present their product at the Big Bang Fair at York Minister and are awarded a trophy for the Best Idea.



- Year 11 sports leaders, Ben Stubbings, Megan Farrow and Alex Richardson, in collaboration with Ryedale's four secondary schools, take part in a life changing project working with young people in Romania, providing a week long summer play scheme.
- Students who are selected to represent the District receive their District Colours unless they have already received them in the past. This year we have 35 students (15 who have already been selected in the past). **Athletics: Tom Everitt, Will Spencer, Alistair Mitchell, Annabelle Francis, Sammy Heslop, Lottie Simpson and Jess Johnson.** Hockey: **Jess Johnson, Emma Wharrick, Annie Farrow, Harriet Beecroft & Lottie Farrow.** Football: **Ryan Gaughan, Morgan Fraser, Liam Palmer-Rippon & Liam Douthwaite.** Netball: **Annabelle Francis.** Tennis: **Maisie Bulmer, Claire Wharrick & Morgan Fraser.**
- In the annual tennis tournament at school, the girls' final sees **Helen Cragges** beat **Emma Wharrick**, whilst in the boys' final **Isaac Johnston** comes out on top, beating **James Criddle**. The mixed doubles title goes to **Samantha Heslop** and **Oscar Johnston** beating **Katie Benson** and **James Simpson**.
- We have exceptional performances on sports day from many of our participants. Best Effort on sports day this year goes to **Kieran Charlton** for his great throw in discus of 30.65m. Best overall performance goes to **William Spencer**. This year there are six records broken, by the following performers; **Annabelle Francis, Megan Bell, Jared Pickering, Samantha Heslop, Kieran Charlton** and **William Spencer**.
- To recognise pupils in each of the individual sports for their hard work and commitment, the following pupils are awarded Player of the Year. - The final point scores has Air a clear winner, followed by Water, Fire and Earth.
- On the last day of term the school's annual talent show sees a variety of high quality musicians, singers and dancers provide excellent entertainment and a brilliant way to end the school year. The winning act is budding magician, Matthew Woollons.

### August

- 2011 GCSE results are once again exceptional, with all key measures of success surpassing our previous best. Five students gain all grade A or A\* results. The best individual performance comes from **Ellen Mitchell** with 7 A\* and 4 A's,
- There are many more A and A\* performances – in fact 28 subjects have an A\* result. Over three quarters (80%) of students achieve 5 or more A\*-C grades.
- At A Level, there are 14 A\* grades at A Level this year, for which students must achieve an average of over 90% in their exams, as well as A grade overall.
- The percentage of grades achieved at A\*-B was up to 43%.
- The average total points score per student is 838 (with 270 points being equivalent to an A grade, this represents just over 3 A grades per student on average).
- The superstars are **Alex Borrill** with 3 A\* in Chemistry, Maths and Physics; **Kieran Leckenby** with 3 A\* in Maths, Further Maths and Physics (plus another A grade); **Louise Smith** with 2 A\* in Maths and Physics (plus another A grade) and **Catherine Sanderson** with 2 A\* in Biology and Chemistry (plus another A grade).
- School is accredited with the full International School Award, recognising the strength of the school's international work both within the curriculum and through our growing extra-curricular provision of residential study visits and foreign exchanges.

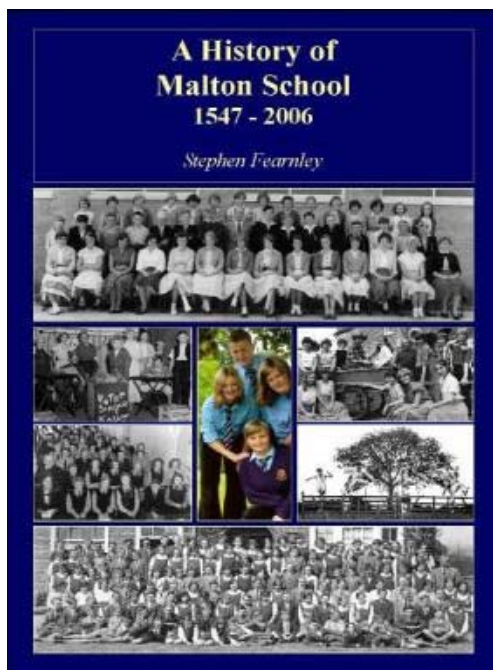
