Recognising Achievement at Malton School

House Points and Congratulatory Referrals

These are awarded for good work throughout the year.

Commendations

On three occasions during the school year teachers are asked to nominate one student in each of their teaching groups who has performed well in respect of the level of attainment they reach, the effort they apply, or the improvement they have made. A commendation letter signed by the Head and Deputy is then presented personally to each student.

House Ties

Students are invited to apply for house ties. Awards are made on the quality of their application. Attendance, effort, house points (at least 500), commendations, service to school, responsibility, and participation in school life are all taken into consideration.

Examinations Success

Grades in all subjects taken are aggregated and students are ranked in order of their performance. The top ten students in each year group receive a letter of congratulations.

Half-termly reward assemblies

Students are recognised for attendance, house points, good records and good performance in a special assembly, where prizes are awarded.

Annual Awards

To qualify for an award, students either gained three or more commendations, or they finished in the top ten in their year group at the end of the school year. A special limited edition of enamel badges is commissioned for the awards, based on the school shield. Even more limited are badges for students who have received awards in three years, five years and seven years. These students also receive a book token.

An annual rewards trip is organised to a local theme park. All students who have achieved fifty house points, but no significant negatives, isolations or detentions, are invited to go on the trip.

Review of 2011-12

September 2011

- We welcome back from their maternity leave Mrs Cooper and Mrs Allan. The school has a population of 734, including 214 students in the sixth form.
- Y12 students enjoy a residential trip to East Barnby.
- The fifth annual rewards trip takes place at Lightwater Valley to reward those students who worked well during the year. The weather is fine and sunny all day. Meanwhile, Year 7 spend the day taking part in various activities at Carlton Lodge Outdoor Activity Centre near Thirsk.
- Y10 students depart on a field trip to York as part of their geography studies.
- Fire fighters join the rescue effort at Gleision mine, south Wales, where miners are trapped 90 metres underground.

October

- Ten students travel to Lincoln for the weekend, staying at the Leadenham Polo Club. Students taught all about the game of polo, given demonstrations and then allocated ponies to have a go themselves.
- The whole school participated in the sponsored walk raising £7,023.80 for Martin House Children's Hospice and the Humanities department at school.
- Students and staff, past and present, meet to celebrate the Centenary of the opening of Malton Grammar School on its current site, as well as the 40th anniversary of Malton School in its present status as an 11-18 comprehensive school.
- Following our achievement of the Full International Schools Award by the British Council, our Special Day had an international theme. Students worked in mixed year group house teams, completing activities and scoring points for their house. The tasks were 'The Haka Challenge', 'The Scandinavian Holiday Task', 'The Landmark Challenge' and 'The Olympic Quiz'.
- English Department hold a poetry competition in response to National Poetry Day.
- American entrepreneur, Steve Jobs, the Apple Inc co-founder, CEO dies at the age of 56 after a long battle with cancer.

November

- The school is very well represented by students, staff and governors at the Remembrance Day service at the War Memorial on Yorkersgate. Students from the school are participating in the ranks of the cadets, the scouts and the guides.
- In Citizenship, Year 8 students have been learning about law and order, with visits to school by York Magistrates who conduct mock trials with groups. Students also visit Malton Police Station, where students watch CCTV cameras whilst one of the students takes part in a 'mock arrest' in a local shop.
- The 13th Annual Celebration Evening takes place. The hall is packed to the limits, as parents and students, governors and special guests gather to review the previous year in the life of the school, reviewing one of the most successful years the school has had.
- Malton School students travel to Gothenburg, Sweden, as part of our Music and Art exchange programme. They spend a week with their Swedish hosts discovering Gothenburg.
- Wales Manager, Gary Speed, found dead at home —no suspicious circumstances.
- Public sector strike over the government's proposals to change pensions—many schools closed to students.
- BBC's annual Children in Need telethon show raises a record total this year—£8m more than in 2010.

December

- A Level geographers head off to London for a study visit focussing on the redevelopment in the nation's capital. Highlight of the trip was a guided tour of the Isle of Dogs and the Olympic Site.
- Abbie Powell and Lily Peacock, who attend the Beauty course at the Academy, gain second and third place in a national competition in Gateshead.
- Jessica Johnson and Douglas Bentley are nominated as the school's Adistars. They are going to be assisted by Gold Ambassadors Benjamin Stubbings and Verity Johnson in the school's preparation for the 2012 Olympics.
- Year 7 Basketball team are crowned Scarborough and District Champions.

- Malton school manage to stage the traditional Christmas celebrations and events with a varied programme of music, song, dance and comedy. The Sixth Form pantomime this year is Harry Potter and the Muggles of Malton.
- The annual invitation to celebrate Christmas went out to senior members of the local community. Guests are treated to food and drink and entertainment from students, as well as receiving gifts from Santa and his helpers.
- Year 7 and 8 students visit St Michael's Church for a carol service. A family carol concert was also held at St Mary the Virgin, Old Malton. Services were conducted by Revd Bowes and Revd Robinson from the churches.
- Air House wins the house trophy for 2011.
- Littlemix wins the X-Factor.
- Harry Morgan, US actor, who gained fame in the 70s/80s in the role of Colonel Potter in the TV show, M*A*S*H, dies at the age of 96.

January 2012

- KS3 students travel to Sheffield MotorPoint Arena to watch the European Figure Skating Championships, followed by a spot of ice-skating themselves at the nearby Ice Sheffield.
- Parents of students in Years 7 and 8 attend our annual Review Day to review progress. Demonstrations take place on the 'parent portal', where parents can view key information about their children on-line.
- Two men convicted of racist murder of black teenager Stephen Lawrence, 18 years after attack in South London.
- Heavy snow blocks roads and rail services in Austria cutting off several ski resorts.
- Alex Salmond, Scottish first minister, says he wants to hold an independence referendum in Scotland in the autumn of 2014.

February

- Year 12 students, as part of their Religion & Philosophy studies, visited the Pocklington Buddhist Centre. Students were given a talk by one of the monks about Buddhist ideas and the way of life at the centre. Students also had an opportunity to try out some breathing meditation and also a chance to mix and chat with members of the community.

- Key Stage 3 Girls badminton team of Emma Wharrick, Vue Sumsard, Annabelle Francis and Lucy O'Brien won the York District Badminton Tournament, proceeding through to the Yorkshire Regional Finals.
- Children's non-fiction author, John Malam, is welcomed into school to speak to Year 9 students. Following an introductory talk about the process of making a book, students took part in a workshop to design and create their own non-fiction book.
- Martial arts trio Joseph Rowland, Joe and Maisie Thomson, return with medals from the Amateur Martial Arts (AMA) Association Open International Karate Championships in Sheffield.
- Snow falls before half-term break and Europe experiences extreme temperatures causing ice chaos on the River Danube.
- Whitney Houston dies at the age of 48 and Frank Carson also passes away at the age of 84.
- Silent movie 'The Artist' triumphs at the Oscars.
- Syria divided—mass funerals become daily event—opposition and innocents killed in clashes with Syrian army.
- Police and bailiffs remove tents from the Occupy London Camp at St Paul's Cathedral.
- Stricken cruise ship Costa Allegra docks in Seychelles—ship lost power and had to be towed to shore.
- Liverpool beat Cardiff City in the Carling Cup final on penalty shootout.

March

- Eleanor Green, Lucy Mitchell and Alice Walker win the Intermediate section of the 'Youth Speaks Competition', taking them through to the District Finals. Samuel Holden, Barnaby Plews and Zachary Davison were placed in the Junior section and are also through to the District Finals.
- The Knitting Club complete Woolsack Project, filling knitted cushions with special British Wool. The cushions will be distributed to the Olympic and Paralympic athletes at the 2012 Olympic Games.
- Year 8 students enjoy a French breakfast whilst doing their food and drink topic.
- Gifted and talented musicians enjoyed a music workshop with professional jazz musician Gareth Williams.

- 'Who Killed the Mad Scientist?' was performed by staff and sixth form students. The fundraising event organised by the PTA raised £421 to go towards a new school mini-bus.
- On Maundy Tuesday, Year 7 student Leah Barker attends Museum Gardens in York to present the Queen with flowers.
- Year 12 students attend a Higher Education Conference at Ampleforth College in order to research post sixth form options.
- Year 7 students become journalists for a day as part of the BBC's School Report Day.
- GCSE students attend the Alhambra Theatre in Bradford to watch the acclaimed production of 'An Inspector Calls' by Stephen Daldry as part of their Literature set text.
- A grand total of £725 was raised when the school went sports mad for Sport Relief.
- The annual Easter shows this year invites people to a night of music. Performers take part on the last two nights of term, all of their performances being inspired by music from television programmes and advertising.
- Students hold an Easter Egg Draw and raise a £91.00 towards Louby's Lifeline.
- Davy Jones from the Monkees dies at the age of 66.

April

- Bags2School raises a staggering £512 towards the Kenyan Expedition.
- Humanities department use part of the monies raised from the sponsored walk to build a shelter (Ollie's Shelter) in memory of Oliver Hudson, a talented young historian.
- Year 9 students venture to Hull University for a taste of university life and learn about university courses on offer around the country.
- Remembrance of Falklands War 30 years ago—a bitter war which saw more than 900 people killed.
- Neptune Collonges, ridden by Daryl Jacob, wins the Grand National.

May

- Year 10 students set out on their five day tour of World War One cemeteries in France.

- Year 9 students take part in the initial stages of Malton Food Festival Competition. The winner, Joseph Anderson and runners-up, Millie French, Megan Bell and Thomas Wing were invited to attend the festival. The overall winner, Joseph, is invited to recreate his winning menu at the Malton Food Lovers Festival.
- Students head off to Leeds Headingley Cricket Ground to represent the school at the 'Day in the Life of a Cricketer'. Students treated to a tour around Headingley and discussed the possible employment roles within cricket.
- Naomi Richardson, Emily Leeson, Bethany Pots and Lauren Still from Y10 join students from each of the local primary schools to visit the Olympic Stadium for the 2012 School Games.
- Students travel to Manchester to watch the Para World Cup Wheelchair Basketball event. They were treated to some exciting play between the GBR men's team playing USA.
- Well done to both Timothy Grey and Russel Quinn. Timothy has been given a scholarship with a professional rugby team in Wales and Russel has been selected to play for the Yorkshire Basketball Team.
- The Malton School Golf team of Lewis Delaney, Jack Hugill and James Mayne were successful in the English Schools Golf Association competition held in Halifax. They now go forward to represent Yorkshire at the National School Finals at Woodhall Spa, Lincolnshire.
- Head Boy and Girl elections are held in which Year 10 students and staff vote, using a transferable vote system.

- Thursday 31 May marks the final day in school for Year 11 with a variety of events through the day culminating with an afternoon filled with entertainment from the students themselves, video clips of students dancing, a video of then and now – Year 7 to 11 school photos – special awards, and much more.

- The Olympic Torch Relay starts at Land's End. 8,000 runners will cover 8,000 miles.
- Powerful earthquake in northern Italy.
- Manchester City fans celebrate as their team clinch the Premier League title—their first since 1968—with a dramatic win over Queens Park Rangers.
- Facebook, the world's biggest social network, went public, making it the most valuable company ever to go public.
- Chancellor George Osborne caves in on his plans to charge the 20% rate of VAT on hot baked snacks such as pasties and pies.
- British boxer, Sir Henry Cooper, dies aged 77.

June

- Year 13 A Level students finish normal timetable classes on Friday 1 June. They have lessons up to breaktime, followed by a special assembly. The school puts on a buffet lunch before they depart to make the necessary preparations for their leavers' ball in the evening.
- Mrs Kettlewell, Mrs Turner and Mrs Bloxwich go on maternity leave. We welcome Mrs Goodwin and Mr Taylor and we welcome back Mrs Tune who returns to school after her maternity leave.
- KS3 students enjoy a break in London, taking in the matinee show 'Mamma Mia' followed by an evening performance of 'Les Miserable'. Students also explored the Natural History Museum followed by a river cruise along the Thames.
- In June we hold our biggest ever Annual Art and Design Exhibition which is extremely well attended by a most enthusiastic and appreciative audience. Hayley North is the winner of the Emma Howard Memorial Trophy.
- 6th form students enjoy the delights of the Yorkshire Sculpture Park at the start of their A2 course.
- Y8 students take a First Aid course within their Citizenship groups endorsed by the British Red Cross, covering basic First Aid including bleeding and using the recovery position.
- Class of 2007-12 gather in their finest suits and dresses for their Prom held in the school hall, arriving in an array of transport from limousine, horse and carriage, tractors, vintage cars, sports cars and even a child's toy tractor!
- Andy Murray reaches the men's final at Wimbledon, but succumbs to the brilliance of Roger Federer.

July

- 100 Year 6 pupils from 16 different primary schools joined us for two taster days to meet and get to know each other. They spend time in their new tutor groups as well as having a taste of lessons in science, history and modern languages. The two days are concluded by a fun sports tournament.
- As part of the Citizenship studies, the Prison Me No Way Trust comes into school to educate students on the consequences of crime and gives an insight into what life is like in prison. Students meet three real prisoners and take part in various workshops throughout the day.
- 21 students from Malton School and Ryedale School depart on their trip to Kenya with Camps International. They will be spending a month in the country helping with local community and wildlife conservation projects, as well as summiting the 4985m Point Lenara of the Mount Kenya region.
- Students who are selected to represent the District receive their District Colours: Athletics—**Annabelle Francis, Thomas Everitt, Scarlett Aldrich, Eleanor Anson**; Hockey—**Annabelle Francis, Samantha Heslop**; Netball—**Charlotte Farrow, Annabelle Francis**; Football—**James Douthwaite, Thomas Everitt**; Cross-Country—**Megan Woollons, Noah Jackson, William Simpson, Megan Bell, Maisie Bulmer, Lauren Simpson, Thomas Everitt, Christiana Pain**.
- In the annual tennis tournament at school, the girls' final sees **Samantha Heslop** beat **Emma Wharrick**, whilst in the boys' final **Thomas Everitt** comes out on top, beating **James Criddle**. The mixed doubles title goes to **Samantha Heslop** and **Matthew Watson** beating **Emma Wharrick** and **Arik Abraham**.
- We have exceptional performances on sports day from many of our participants. Best Effort on sports day this year goes to **Natasha Scott** for her willingness to fulfil events other students could not. Best overall performance goes to **Annabelle Francis**. This year there are six records broken, by the following performers; **Annabelle Francis** 200m (28.30), **Lauren Simpson** 300m (50.15), **Christiana Pain** 800m (2.47.90) & 1500m (5.56), **Megan Bell** 1500m (6.29), **Stephanie Bramley** High Jump (1.36m) and **Robert Holmes** High Jump (1.5m).

- To recognise pupils in each of the individual sports for their hard work and commitment, the following pupils are awarded Player of the Year. - On sports day the final point scores has Water a clear winner, followed by Fire, Air and Earth.
- On the last day of term the school's annual talent show sees a variety of high quality musicians, singers and dancers provide excellent entertainment and a brilliant way to end the school year. The winning act is budding magician, Matthew Woollons.
- We say farewell to colleagues due to retirement or promotion elsewhere. These are Mr Fearnley (Deputy Head), Mrs Pippa Dore (Head of Humanities), Mrs Christine Richardson (Special Needs Coordinator), Mrs Jane Wilford (Special Needs Teacher); Ms Ann Lester (Teacher of Business Studies); Mrs Nicky-Jo Cooper (Teacher of Science), Mrs Susan Lemmetyinen (Teacher of Modern Languages) and Mr Cliff Reddyhoff (Senior Science Technician).
- The opening ceremony of the 2012 Summer Olympic Games takes place in the Olympic Stadium, London, directed by award winning director Danny Boyle.
- Robin Gibb from the Bee Gees dies at the age of 62 after his battle with cancer.
- Abdelbaset al-Megrahi, Libyan terrorist, convicted of bombing Pan Am Flight 103, Lockerbie, dies.

August

- 2012 GCSE results—overall percentage of students achieving 5 or more A*-C grades rose to 81.2% surpassing our previous best. Four students gain all grade A or A* results (**Steven Fenwick, William Spencer, Holly Johnson** and **Emily Farrow**). The best individual performance comes from **Steven Fenwick** with 7 A* and 2 A's.

- At A Level, the pass rate is 99.2%. In total, 64 A* and A grades are achieved. The percentage of grades achieved at A*-B was up to 50%. At A Level, 11 students gained A* or A in all of their main subjects. They were **Ian Mason** (3 A* + A grade), **James Douthwaite** (3 A*), Jack Bradshaw (2 A* + 2A), **Clara Rawlings** and **Katie Sunley** (2 A* + A), **Alice Thompson** (A* + 2A), **Jenna Keys**, **Kate Dagleish** and **Megan Wood** (4A), **Aya Abrahams** and **Thomas Gentry** (3A).
- Team GB had numerous successes at the 2012 Summer Olympic Games, with a total of 29 Gold, 17 Silver and 19 Bronze medals, placing them third on the medal table behind the USA and China!
- Many outstanding performances including Andy Murray in the Men's Tennis Final, beating Roger Federer 2-6, 1-6, 4-6.

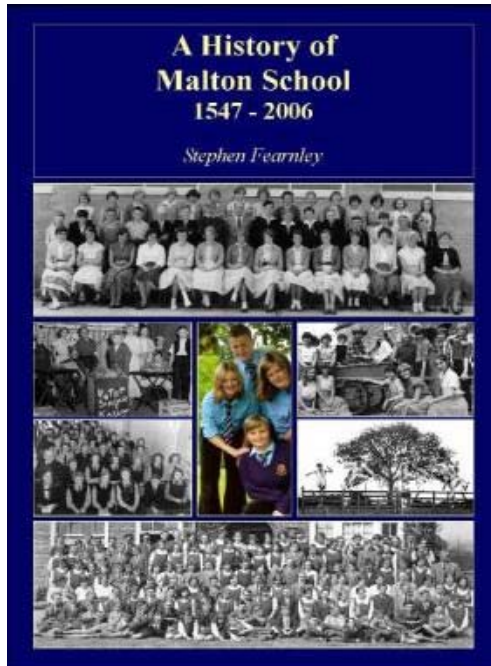
