Recognising Achievement at Malton School

House Points and Congratulatory Referrals

These are awarded for good work throughout the year.

Commendations

On three occasions during the school year teachers are asked to nominate one student in each of their teaching groups who has performed well in respect of the level of attainment they reach, the effort they apply, or the improvement they have made. A commendation letter signed by the Head and Deputy is then presented personally to each student.

House Ties

Students are invited to apply for house ties. Awards are made on the quality of their application. Attendance, effort, house points (at least 500), commendations, service to school, responsibility, and participation in school life are all taken into consideration.

Examinations Success

Grades in all subjects taken are aggregated and students are ranked in order of their performance. The top ten students in each year group receive a letter of congratulations.

Half-termly reward assemblies

Students are recognised for attendance, house points, good records and good performance in a special assembly, where prizes are awarded.

Annual Awards

To qualify for an award, students either gained three or more commendations, or they finished in the top ten in their year group at the end of the school year. A special limited edition of enamel badges is commissioned for the awards, based on the school shield. Even more limited are badges for students who have received awards in three years, five years and seven years. These students also receive a book token.

An annual rewards trip is organised to a local theme park. All students who have achieved fifty house points, but no significant negatives, isolations or detentions, are invited to go on the trip.

Review of 2012-13

September 2012

- We welcome six new members to the teaching staff: Mr Taylor to Music, Mr Oakes and Ms Butcher to Languages, Mrs Goodwin and Mrs McGrath to the English Department and Mrs Leetham to Science. Mr O'Brien joins the Science Department and Mrs Ingham, Mrs Richardson and Ms Wright as Teaching Assistants.
- Y12 students enjoy a residential trip to East Barnby.
- School introduce a new homework club.
- The annual rewards trip takes place at Flamingoland to reward those students who worked well during the year. The weather is fine and sunny all day. Meanwhile, Year 7 spend the day taking part in various activities at Carlton Lodge Outdoor Activity Centre near Thirsk.
- Magistrates from York and Selby Magistrates Courts visit school to speak to Y8 students about the role of Magistrates.
- 2012 Summer Paralympic Games held in London. GB won 34 Gold, 43 Silver and 43 Bronze medals.

October

- Y12 students experience a performance of Shakespeare's Othello at the York Theatre Royal after weeks of studying the play.
- The whole school participate in the sponsored walk raising £5,807.43 for the Music and Arts Departments and a new minibus for the school.
- Y9 geographers look at flooding in York.
- English Department hold a poetry competition in response to National Poetry Day. Winners are Eleanor Smith (Y7), Bryony Wells (Y8), Rachel Dawson (Y9), Ben Riley in 6th form and Ms Sara Thorpe in the staff category.
- Local author of 'The Witcher Keys', I.R. Johnson, visits the school library and students are treated to some extracts read by actress, Cal Stockbridge.
- Austrian Felix Baumgartner becomes the first skydiver to go faster than the speed of sound, reaching a maximum velocity of 833.9mph.
- Hurricane Sandy hits New York causing much flooding and damage.
- 14-year-old Pakistani schoolgirl Malala Yousufzai, is shot in Mingora, in the Swat Valley by the Taliban for speaking out in support of education for women.

November

- Parents of students in Years 7 attend our annual Review Day to review progress.
- The school is very well represented by students, staff and governors at the Remembrance Day service at the War Memorial on Yorkersgate. Students from the school are participating in the ranks of the cadets, the scouts and the guides.
- In Citizenship, Year 8 students have been learning about law and order, with visits to Malton Police Station, where students watch CCTV cameras whilst one of the students takes part in a 'mock arrest' in a local shop.
- The Annual Celebration Evening takes place. The hall is packed to the limits, as parents and students, governors and special guests gather to review the previous year in the life of the school.
- Flooding across the country including Malton. Daniel Kilmartin and Lottie Farrow take donations of cakes and goodies to the Salvation Army distribution centre for the emergency services, volunteers and victims.
- Students raise £758.96 for Children in Need.
- Police and crime commissioner elections take place across the country.
- Clive Dunn (Corporal Jones in Dad's Army) dies at age 92.
- Coronation Street's Jack Duckwork (Bill Tarmy) dies at the age of 71 in Tenerife.
- President Obama re-elected for another term of office.

December

- Y7 students organise bring and buy sale and raise £120 for the Sidings Hostel in Malton, helping young people in the community.
- Malton students join in campaign to keep Malton Hospital's Minor Injury Unit open.
- Malton School manage to stage the traditional Christmas celebrations and events with a varied programme of music, song, dance and comedy. New style Christmas Concert enjoyed by all directed by new music teacher Mr Taylor.
- The annual invitation to celebrate Christmas went out to senior members of the local community. Guests are treated to food and drink and entertainment from students, as well as receiving gifts from Santa and his helpers.

- Year 7 and 8 students visit St Michael's Church for a carol service. A family carol concert was also held at St Mary the Virgin, Old Malton.
- James Arthur wins the X-Factor.

January 2013

- Y10 students visit York Magistrates Court as part of their Society & Belief GCSE module topic, Crime and Punishment.
- School remains open even though country hit with snowy and icy conditions.
- Extreme weather conditions causing raging fires in Australia.
- Prince Harry arrives home from Afghanistan after a 4 month tour of duty.

February

- York Potash deliver presentation to Y9 geography students about plans to open new potash mine on North Yorkshire Moors national Park.
- Y8 geography students participate in a series of workshops run by Animals– in-Tuition, involving creatures from the desert and rainforest ecosystems.
- South African paralympic athlete Oscar Pistorius is arrested over the fatal shooting of his girlfriend Reeva Steenkamp at his home.

March

- PTA organise a Parent Forum meeting—'Ugh, Dad, we don't do it like that any more!' Parents invited into school to find out how Maths is taught at Malton School.
- Students take part in the Rotary 'Youth Speaks Competition', covering topics on whether schools put too much pressure on academic success, Youtube, and green tax on aviation fuel.
- Y12 students attend workshops on the inner workings of fiction at the Scarborough Literature Festival, run by award winning novelists Alex Wheatle, MBE, Susanna Jones and Christopher Brookmyre.
- The annual Easter shows this year invites people to a night of music. Performers take part on the last night of term, with the audiences enjoying performances from the jazz band, blues performers, soul band, string group as well as individual acts.
- Students and staff did something funny for money, including the 'Harlem Shake' to raise funds for comic Relief. A grand total of £777 was raised on the day.

- Y13 students complete First Aid course run by the British Red Cross.
- Students hold an Easter Egg Draw and raise a £131.29 for The Sidings, Malton.
- Girls Badminton team (Eleanor Mawson, Emma Wharrick, View Sumsard and Lucy O'Brien) win through to the Yorkshire Finals of the Centre Parcs National School Competition.
- Y7 rugby team progress to the East Yorkshire Finals.
- Well done to Christiana Pain who won a gold medal in the U17 Girls National Relay Road Race in Birmingham.
- Y10 football team win the District six-a-side football tournament at Ryedale School.
- Congratulations to William Rowe who has been selected for North Yorkshire basketball, Samantha Heslop who has been selected for Yorkshire Cricket, Liam Palmer-Rippin and Ryan Gaughan who have both been selected to play for District U15 football.
- PTA hold quiz raising £916 for school funds.
- Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio is elected as Pope after the resignation of Pope Benedict. He is to be known as Pope Francis.
- Wales triumph over England to win the Six Nations.

April

- Students from Years 8, 9 and 10 took part in the Jersey Sports Tour, playing competitive football and netball matches over a weekend.
- Non-uniform day raises a grand total of £426 for the Macmillan Nurses.
- Year 9 and 10 students involved in a series of lessons on sexual health matters. Professor Robert Newton from York University came in to talk about his work in Uganda with the AIDS Research Unit, which was followed by a visit from NHS Trust sexual health nurses, Helen Browse and Mari Louise Fountain.
- 66/1 shot Auroras Encore, ridden by Ryan Mania, wins the Grand National.
- Baroness Thatcher (aka the 'Iron Lady') dies at the age of 87.

May

- Year 10 history students set out on their five day tour of World War One battlefields in France, where they visit a range of museums, memorials and cemeteries.

- Year 9 students take part in the initial stages of Malton Food Festival Competition. Niamh Williams, Sophie Reeves, Claire Wharrick and Heather Staples were invited to attend the festival. The final round was judged at the festival by celebrity chef, Stephanie Moon, awarding all the finalists a prize of afternoon tea at Rudding Park Hotel.
- **The school's Jazz Band entertained at the food festival at which they raised £166.**
- Malton School Soul Band perform in a battle of the bands at the Grand Opera House, York. Despite the name it was more of a friendly event than a battle as the proceeds went to charity.
- Jazz Band performs at the Tate-Smith's 125th Anniversary Ball as well as other venues throughout the following months.

- Friday 24 May marks the final day in school for Year 11 with a variety of events through the day culminating with an afternoon filled with entertainment from the students themselves, video clips of students dancing, a video of then and now – Year 7 to 11 school photos – special awards, and much more.
- The whole of Year 9 visit the Ryedale Folk Museum where they participated in special World War II activities.

June

- Class of 2008-13 gather in their finest suits and dresses for their Prom held in the school hall, arriving in an array of transport from tractors new and vintage, limousine, open top cars and a camper van!
- PE teacher, Mr Green, completes Coast to Coast raising money for Cancer Research UK.
- Andy Murray wins his first Wimbledon title and ended Britain's 77-year wait for a men's champion with a hard fought victory over world number one Novak Djokovic.

July

- KS3 students enjoy a break in London. Students enjoy a trip on the London Eye followed by tea at 'Fire and Stone'. In the evening they took in the magnificent show 'Matilda'. On day two, students visited the British Museum followed by the Harry Potter Experience.
- KS4 students enjoyed a performance by 'An Invisible Man', a group which performs in schools outlining risk behaviour.
- Students in 8H complete 10 week first aid course with the help of the Red Cross.
- School PTA have given approximately £4,000 towards school facilities, including self-activating clocks in all classrooms, first aid mannequins, materials for DT, equipment for PE and Music department and also screen, projector and sound equipment for the new drama studio.
- 7A held a bake sale and bring and buy sale raising £30 for Malala Day.

- Year 6 pupils joined us from Primary Schools around Ryedale for two taster days to meet and get to know each other. They spend time in their new tutor groups as well as having a taste of lessons in science, history and modern languages.

- On sports day the final point scores has Water a clear winner, followed by Fire, Air and Earth.
- We have exceptional performances on sports day from many of our participants. Best Effort on sports day this year goes to Lydia Porter. Best overall performance goes to Stephanie Bramley. This year there are eight records broken, by the following performers; George Austin 1500m (5.39min) and high jump (1.40m), Sarah Young 300m (52.66s), Stephanie Bramley 300m (47.18s) and high jump (1.55m), Annabelle Francis 200m (27.65s) and Maisie Bulmer 1500m (6.13m) and 800m (2.52m).
- School received plenty of visitors to its stall at Malton Show. The Jazz Band played all day, Matthew Woollons wowed the crowds with his magic routine and visitors, old and young alike enjoyed **the activities on display. The President's Special Award for the KS3 Art competition was awarded to Isabel Donaldson.**

- 2013 GCSE results—overall percentage of students achieving 5 or more A*-C grades including English and Maths, was a new record high at 65%. Nine students gain all grade A or A* results (Ailsa Anson, Christopher Grayson, Charlotte Housden, Emily Metcalfe, Alistair Mitchell, Philippa Norman, Naomi Richardson, James Simpson and Imogen Smith).
- At A Level, the pass rate is 99%. The percentage of grades achieved at A*-B was up to 52%. At A Level, eight students gained A* or A in all of their main subjects. They were Harry Hodgson, James Poole, Richard Ware, Joe Spencer, Laura Crick, Fraser Hudson, Hepzibah Baldwin, Alex Thorn and Ebony-Jane Ward.

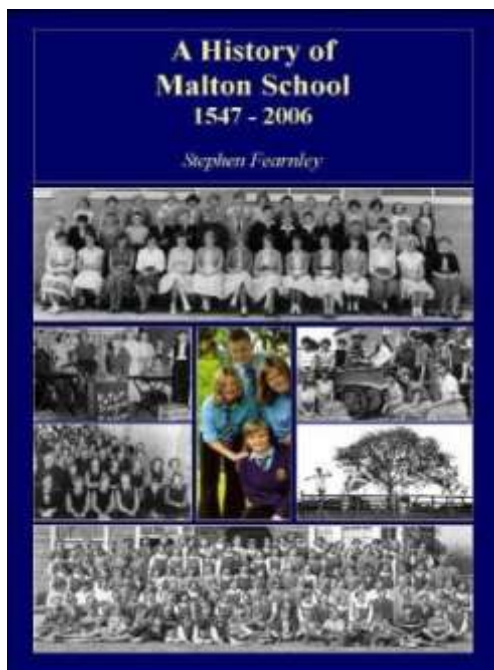
