Recognising Achievement at Malton School

House Points and Congratulatory Referrals

These are awarded for good work throughout the year.

Commendations

On three occasions during the school year teachers can nominate up to three students in each of their teaching groups who have performed well in respect of the level of attainment they reach, the effort they apply, or the improvement they have made. A commendation letter signed by the Head and Head of Key Stage is then presented personally to each student.

House Ties

Students are invited to apply for house ties. Awards are made on the quality of their application. Attendance, effort, house points (at least 500), commendations, service to school, responsibility, and participation in school life are all taken into consideration.

Examinations Success

Grades in all subjects taken are aggregated and students are ranked in order of their performance. The top ten students in each year group receive a letter of congratulations.

Half-termly reward assemblies

Students are recognised for attendance, house points, good records and good performance in a special assembly, where prizes are awarded.

Annual Awards

To qualify for an award, students either gained four or more commendations, or they finished in the top ten in their year group at the end of the school year. A special limited edition of enamel badges is commissioned for the awards, based on the school shield. Even more limited are badges for students who have received awards in three years, five years and seven years

An annual rewards trip is organised to a local theme park. All students who have achieved fifty house points, but no significant negatives, isolations or detentions, are invited to go on the trip.

Review of 2013-14

September 2013

- Year 12 students enjoy a residential trip to East Barnby.
- Year 11 students undertake coastal field work as part of their Geography GCSE course.
- Annual Open Evening is well attended by parents and prospective students.
- The annual rewards trip takes place at Flamingoland to reward those students who worked well during the year. Meanwhile, Year 7 spend the day taking part in various activities at Carlton Lodge Outdoor Activity Centre near Thirsk.
- World heavy weight boxing champion Ken Norton dies aged 70.

October

- Pete Dwyer the Director of Children's Services NYCC officially opens the Drama Studio followed by a fantastic evening filled with song and dance by the Pearl of Africa Children's Choir.
- The whole school participates in the sponsored walk raising over £5,000 for the ongoing school minibus fund.
- GCSE Drama students enjoy a trip to York Theatre Royal to see the play by Smooth Faced Gentlemen 'Titus Andronicus'. An all female cast with original Shakespearian language, with a modern set and presentation.
- Year 11 participate in the careers roadshow.
- The biggest trial into phone hacking (allegedly) begins at the Old Bailey in London. Rebekah Brooks and Andy Coulson are among the eight defendants who are charged.
- New south Wales declares a state of emergency after Australian bushfires destroys 200 homes.
- Airports and schools in north-eastern China forced to close by severe air pollution—visibility reduced to 20 yards by the smog.
- Musician Lou Reed passes away, aged 71.
- Best selling author Tom Clancy, dies, aged 66. His novels included Patriot Games, The Hunt for Red October and Clear and Present Danger.

November

- Parents of students in Year 7 attend our annual Review Day to review progress.

- In Citizenship, Year 8 students have been learning about law and order, with visits to Malton Police Station, where students watch CCTV cameras whilst one of the students takes part in a 'mock arrest' in a local shop.
- The Annual Celebration Evening takes place. The hall is packed to the limits, as parents and students, governors and special guests gather to review the previous year in the life of the school.
- Year 10 Health and Social Care students are out in the community providing support for service users in care settings.
- A major storm causes extensive damage across southern England with strong gusts of 99mph recorded on the Isle of Wight.
- Three women are freed from a house in south London reportedly after '30 years of slavery'.
- Alex Salmond, Scotland's First Minister, unveils the SNP's independence blueprint.
- Fraud trial begins of Grillo sisters, former personal assistants to Nigella Lawson and Charles Saatchi.
- Ten killed and many more injured after a police helicopter crashes into the Clutha bar in Gasgow.

December

- Malton School manage to stage the traditional Christmas celebrations and events with a varied programme of music, song, dance and comedy. For the first time the show was presented by our key stage three leaders Barnaby Plews, Zachary Davison, Isabel Grayson and Megan Woollons.
- The annual invitation to celebrate Christmas went out to Friends of Malton School at the annual party. Guests are treated to food and drink and entertainment from students, as well as receiving gifts from Santa and his helpers.
- Year 7 and 8 students attend St Michael's Church for a carol service and a family carol concert was also held at St Mary the Virgin, Old Malton.
- Youngest CEO in the country, Alan Mak, comes into school through the Speakers for Schools Charity Organisation to deliver a speech to sixth form students entitled 'From classroom to boardroom'.
- Nelson Mandela, South Africa's ex-president dies, aged 95.
- Robbie Biggs, the Great Train Robber, dies aged 84.
- Lawrence of Arabia actor Peter O'Toole dies, aged 81.

January 2014

- Young trainee doctors come from York University to give a talk about 'sexpression'.
- Year 10 GCSE Society and Belief students visit York Crown and Magistrates Courts for an eye-opening experience to witness how our country deals with criminal activity and how the justice system works.
- Malton School welcomes Pete Dwam who works for the NARCONON charity (say no to narcotics!) and is an ex-drug user, into school to give a talk to students about his journey with drugs.
- England Women's cricket team retain the Ashes after winning the first Twenty20 international by nine wickets in Australia.

February

- Group of six Y11 students have working lunch with medical students at York University to gain an understanding on how to enter the world of medicine.
- Intermediate maths challenge takes place.
- The Ebola virus epidemic in West African begins, infecting 10,000 people and killing at least 5,000.
- The XII Olympic Winter Games are held in Sochi, Russia.
- Iconic child star of all time, Shirley Temple, passes away at the age of 85.
- Last surviving member of the famous musical von Trapp family, Maria von Trapp, passes away at the age of 99.

March

- 48 student and staff depart for ski trip to Serre Chevalier in France.
- Students take part in the Rotary Youth Speaks Competition held at Lady Lumley's School, Pickering. The intermediate team of Isabel Grayson, Samuel Holden and Barnabas Plews won their completion and progress to the district finals in York.
- People are invited to a night of music enjoying performances from the jazz band, blues performers, soul band, string group as well as individual acts.
- Students and staff raise funds for Comic Relief in the grand total of £842.25.
- Former Deputy Head, Steve Fearnley, re-creates the Maltonians

- Year 7 students hold an Easter Egg Draw and raise a £126.32 for Make a Wish Foundation.
- School move to an online payment system 'ParentPay' which removes the need to send cheques or cash to school to pay for trips and music lessons.
- Busy term for geography fieldwork—Year 7 students carry out surveys in Malton town centre, Year 8 students take part in workshops run by 'Animals In-tuition' - learning how creatures survive in different ecosystems, and Year 12 students visit Leeds to compare different residential areas of the city, as well as an afternoon at Flamborough Head looking at the famous landforms created in the chalk rock.
- GCSE drama group visit the York Theatre Royal to see 'Birdsong' a stage show based on the world famous novel by Sebastian Faulks.
- Malaysia Airlines Flight 370, a Boeing 777 airliner en route to Beijing from Kuala Lumpur disappears over the Gulf of Thailand.

April

- Year 10 student Stephanie Bramley takes 1st place overall in the U17 girls category at the Yorkshire Regional Triathlon Championships in York.
- Forty students embark on a five day tour of the WW1 Battlefields in Belgium and France as part of their GCSE history course.
- Year 10 field visit to Hutton-le-Hole which is a Honeypot village (called this because they attract such large numbers of visitors).
- Nearly 300 girls and women are abducted and held hostage from a school in Nigeria.
- Korean ferry MV Sewoi capsizes and sinks killing 290 people, mostly high school students.
- One of the most famous child stars, Mickey Rooney, passes away at the age of 93.
- British actor Bob Hoskins, famous for his role in Who Framed Roger Rabbit, passes away aged 71.

May

- Joseph Rowland Year 11 and Maisie Thomson Year 12 win Gold in their Kumite (fighting) categories in the Yorkshire Open Karate Championships.
- Year 10 sport leaders attend Norton Primary School's athletics

- A group of 40 Year 11 and 12 students attend an event organised and hosted by Malton School to meet representatives from Oxford and Cambridge Universities. Students from Lady Lumley's School and Norton College were also invited to attend.
- Year 11 students watch a performance of Nobel Prize-winning author John Steinbeck's 'Of Mice and Men' at the West Yorkshire Playhouse in Leeds.
- Science department welcome gifted and talented students in years 5 and 6 from feeder primary schools to carry out experiments and tasks to stretch and challenge students.
- Whole of Year 9 visit Hull University to take part in a series of careers focussed workshops and a tour of the university.
- Year 10 students take part in the Annual Cookery Competition as part of the Malton Food Festival. Four students take part in the final cook-off, the overall winner Reece Langford looks forward to a day cooking with James Martin in the kitchens of the Talbot Hotel.

- Sixth Form senior students organise a prom ball at The Royal York to celebrate the end of their time at school. Students and staff gathered to enjoy a three course meal in the beautiful surroundings of the City of York.

June

- Year 9 students enjoy a trip out to the Ryedale Folk Museum, where they participated in special WWII activities.
- Getting to Know You—for two days at the end of the summer term, Year 6 pupils from primary schools across Ryedale come into School to get to know each other. A first chance for pupils to come together before starting in September, spend time in their new tutor groups as well as having a taste of lessons.

- Class of 2009-14 gather in their finest suits and dresses for their Prom held in the school hall, arriving in an array of transport from tractors new and vintage, limousine and open top cars.
- School receive plenty of visitors to its stall at Malton Show. Musicians played all day and old and young alike enjoyed the activities on display. The President's Special Award for the KS3 Art competition was awarded to Venetia Mitchell.
- 2014 FIFA World Cup is held in Brazil and is won by Germany.
- King Juan Carlos I of Spain abdicates in favour of his son, who ascends the Spanish throne as King Felipe VI.

July

- Malton school students leave for expedition to Borneo. In partnership with Ryedale School, 31 students aged 16 to 18 visit the island of Borneo to make a contribution to the people and its environment through meaningful project work.
- Geography Department win a prestigious national award in recognition of excellence in teaching geography.
- 50 students and staff spend five days performing, practising their French and visiting war memorials on a music and French study trip to Normandy, France.
- Prison me no way - students in Years 9 and 10 enjoy a day with the national educational charity raising awareness among young people about the causes, consequences and penalties of crime.
- Ryedale Book Festival—English Department welcomes Justin Huggler in conjunction with the Ryedale Book Festival into school to deliver a talk on his experiences as the former war correspondent for the Independent. Evening of poetry with Danny Martin an ex-soldier, poet and teacher.
- Summer concert takes place with an evening of music and song.
- We hold our Year 6 induction evening and our Annual Art and Design Exhibition on the same evening. Both events are extremely well attended by a most enthusiastic and appreciative audience. Henrietta Carter is the winner of the Emma Howard Memorial Trophy.
- The summer concert is held at the end of term with performances from the Orchestra, Glee Club, Jazz Band, Soul Band together with many other individual performances.
- In the annual tennis tournament at school, the girls' final sees Lucy Walker beat Daisy Ferguson whilst in the boys' final Robert Ingram comes out on top, beating Brendan Raistrick. The mixed

- Malton students take part in the Ryedale's Got Talent Competition at the Milton Rooms along with other neighbouring schools. The competition is won by Malton's Zac and George.
- We say farewell to colleagues due to retirement or promotion elsewhere. These are Mrs Green (Citizenship/RE Teacher), Mr Richardson (Head of Upper School/History Teacher) and Dr Barratt (Science Teacher).
- Scotland host Commonwealth Games in Glasgow—athletes from 53 nations are brought together to compete in a programme including events for para-sports. England headed the medal table with 58 gold medals.

August

- 2014 GCSE results – best results in Ryedale! Overall percentage of students achieving 5 or more A*-C grades including English and Maths, was a new record high at 74%. 32% attained 5 or more grades at A or A*. There were also 15 students in the year group who achieved at least 3 A* grades.
- A level results are equally impressive. Students in Year 13 secured an astonishing average total points score of 901. This is the equivalent of three 'A*' grades at full A level. It places Malton School amongst the top attaining sixth forms in North Yorkshire.
- US actor Robin Williams dies at the age of 63.
