Commendations

A commendation letter signed by the Head and Deputy is then presented personally to each student.

Examinations Success

Grades in all subjects taken are aggregated and students are ranked in order of their performance. The top students in each year group receive a letter of congratulations on their achievement.

In 1999 the first awards were made to all Malton School students who had performed well during the school year 1998-9. To qualify for an award, they either gained three or more commendations, or they finished in the top ten in their year group.

A special limited edition of enamel badges was commissioned for the awards, based on the school shield which we use as a simple but instantly recognisable symbol of quality at Malton School.

Review of 1998-9

September

- 5 new staff join us Mr Harvey as Head of PE, Miss Robinson to teach Design Technology and Games, Mr Sibley as Head of Upper School and Careers, Ms Smith as Head of Modern Foreign Languages, and Mrs Allsopp to teach French.
- Network cabling is installed throughout the school, as the first stage of the National Grid for Learning project.
- Major developments in the Music Suite are completed, with new carpets laid in the practice rooms.
- Year 12 start their A-level course with a residential trip to East Barnby
- The annual Sponsored Walk raises a record £3210 which we bank towards the improvements to computer facilities.
- The School Internet site is launched thanks to the efforts of IT technician, Graham Magee

October

- Students from Years 7 to 9 visit Dinard in France.
- Students studying A-level and GCSE Geography go to East Barnby for their field study residential stay.
- Year 10 Non-Geographers spend three days in and around Malham in the Yorkshire Dales caving, walking, and orienteering.
- A new prospectus is published, featuring an aerial view of Malton and surrounding area.

November

- New windows are installed across the whole front of West Wing
- The School open evening attracts a wide audience the theme of the evening is Past, Present and Future at Malton School. This is the last November evening before we move to a July event.
- Year 11 receive their GCSE certificates from Mr Roger Thomas, who retired in the summer of 1998, after 28 years of service to the school.
- A small group of staff and governors begin meeting to plan a major appeal for funds for new Art studios, new ICT room and new library.

December

- The 25th Senior Citizens Party is held at the end of term, and is as successful as ever.
- Children's author Theresa Breslin visits the school and talks with students about writing books, as part of our celebration of the National Year of Reading.

January

- The Maltonians Database Project is launched an attempt to contact as many former Malton students as possible, and record information about the School's past on a dedicated website. Replies from all over the world and all professions are received.
- Jazz band *The Perfect Houseplants* perform at the school
- Year 10 Art students spend a day studying Indian textiles with artists Caroline Crabtree and Christine Shaw.

February

- The Maltonians Library and ICT Appeal was formally launched by patron Sir Marcus Worsley, at a special evening event which was well attended despite the heavy snowfall.
- Mrs Green left on maternity leave
- Student Katie Aylmer attends a 'cello masterclass with maestro Andrew Baillie at Ampleforth College
- Students do well in the UK Maths challenge Sam Clarke achieving a Gold Award, and Abigail Clark went forward to a European competition.
- North Yorkshire ambulanceman Paul Jackson visits to teach mouth to mouth resuscitation and cardiac arrest techniques to a wide range of age groups over many weeks.

March

- All schools in Malton close for two days due to severe flooding in Malton and surrounding areas. Some students have to wade in to sit modular A-level exams. The school acts as an emergency evacuation centre. The floods make headline news all over the world.
- 56 students from all years depart on the annual ski trip this year to Gressoney in Italy.
- The Easter concert takes place at the end of March a great success, with a variety of music played to a packed school hall.
- 41 students and 6 staff from a school in Trondheim, Norway visit the school
- Year 7 visit York as part of their History studies.

April

- Year 9 visit Eden Camp as part of their History studies
- A meeting of former Malton pupils, mainly pre-1950, takes place at the Green Man
- Sixth Formers travel to Stratford to see Othello at the RST
- Year 10 and 11 students spend a day at Strensall Barracks on an Army Personal Development course
- Mrs Green's daughter, Ellie, arrives into the world.
- The School is saddened to hear of the death of Dame Christian Howard at the age of 82 - a governor at the school over many years.

May

- The new Art studios are opened by local sculptor Simon Thackray, with an exhibition of A level and GCSE work. A very successful and enjoyable evening.
- A reunion of 1970-75 pupils takes place at the Bowling Club, Norton.
- Tyne Tees Television spend a day filming in school with Sixth Formers who are involved in a counselling service for younger pupils.

June

- Year 10 students go on two weeks work experience
- The School receives a Sportsmark Award, recognising its commitment to developing sport to a high level.
- Year 8 students spend a day at Beamish museum
- Year 7 students spend a week camping
- Exam season!

July

- Our first summer open evening takes place in the middle of a heatwave, one of the warmest nights on record
- In the last Sports Day contested between Rye, Seven and Derwent House, Seven emerge as clear winners 94 points ahead of Derwent. From September new houses will be Air, Earth, Fire and Water.
- Matthew Young breaks the Year 7 boys high jump record, Stephen Baxter the Year 8 record, and Vicki Anderson breaks the Year 10 girls discus record.
- Natalie Miller wins the girls tennis tournament, Bobby Brewer the boys'. Matthew Hayward and Samantha Wiggle take the Mixed Doubles.
- We say farewell to four members of staff Mrs Allsopp moves to Bath, Mr Vagianos moves to a new school in Cheshire, Mr Organ moves to a new school in Leeds, and Mrs Thomas retires after some 15 years of service to the School.
- Students enjoy the end of term activities day doing archery, fishing, glass painting, golf, IT, orienteering, rock climbing, trampolining, skiing, or day-tripping to Flamingoland, Lightwater Valley and Wet 'n' Wild.

August

- A total eclipse of the sun takes place over Cornwall about 80% up here in Malton, but at least we didn't have the clouds.
- The new ICT room is decorated and refurnished. Boxes and boxes of new computers arrive and are installed.
- The school's best ever A-level results are announced
- One week later, GCSE results match our previous best.
