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### Fingers on the pulse

Students in the school have been having their fingerprints scanned. This is not part of any criminal investigation, but the new way the school is running its library book-issue system.

All our borrowing system is now operated electronically, with bar codes in every book. The latest addition is a small fingerprint scanner which creates a code for every student, who then registers simply by pressing on the scanner. The computer then shows a photograph of the student, taken on a small web-cam, to confirm their identity. No more library cards lost or forgotten – students usually remember to bring their fingers!

The new school library was opened in February 2000 following a successful £100000 Library and ICT Appeal. From the start new technology has been a feature of the library: computerised issue, internet access, listening stations, and the addition of video, compact disc, and audio tapes to the large book stock, are just some of the features of this welcome addition to the School's facilities.

Anyone concerned about privacy in relation to the new device need have no fears. The computer does not actually store fingerprints or images of fingerprints, just codes relating to the print on one finger. We could not print them out for example.

### School Growth

Our September return to County Hall showed 601 students on roll, with 75 joining us this year in the Sixth Form and 100 in Year 7. This is the largest population in school for many years - a significant increase (24%) from our lowest, which in 1994-5 was 483.

### Maltonians News

On Saturday 6 October a group of twenty six people met and had a tour of the East Wing of the school. For some of them it was the first time they had set foot in the school for nearly 45 years - they were the intake of 1952, brought together by the efforts of Howard Fox through countless phone calls and letters. The conversations continued throughout the tour, paused briefly for group photos, then resumed over lunch at The Wentworth Arms.

The group generously donated £40 to the school library, with which we have purchased two reference books - *the Radio Times Guide to Films* and *A Guide to Science Fiction*, as well a photo album to store pictures of this and other reunion groups.

### Internet problems

Our apologies go to anyone who has been trying to view our websites. The main school website has not been updated for some time due to a problem on its host computer - we are considering moving it to a new address. The Maltonians website was out of service for about two weeks due to problems with the ISP.

At the same time the administration network at school has been upgraded, and a few teething problems were experienced with e-mail. Add to this the installation of a digital phone system and broadband capacity, and everything has conspired to give us more headaches than we would like! Who says ICT makes things easier!

We hope all the electronic communications will be back fully functional in the very near future, please bear with us a little longer.

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## Anti-bullying week

On Monday 1 October our anti-bullying week started with a visit from The Waterfall Theatre Company, from Manchester. All Year 7 and 8 pupils watched *A Bit of Fun* in West Wing Hall - a play about Timmy, who had moved schools and became a victim of bullying by two older girls.

The play was a very effective way of introducing the week - most of us will remember its message - "Bullying affects many lives - PLEASE TELL SOMEONE"
